he challenges and opportunities of the last few years have paid off. As many of you know, we have been on an upward path. This fall, I am proud to say that we have

broken through the barrier and really taken the University and entire Greek community by storm. Our leadership throughout the chapter has given the new members a positive outlook, and I am very optimistic they will be the next leaders on the Kansas State campus.

Accomplishments

For the fall semester, we have 54 men living in the chapter house. Our capacity is 55. We have not been this full for at least 10 years. This is an amazing accomplishment and ties directly to the leadership of our recruitment team as they continually bring in the best talent. In other news, our GPA last spring was 3.1, a significant improvement

over the previous year. With a 3.1 average, we surpassed the university all-men's GPA and were 11th out of the 25 fraternities. Both of these are great strides, and we continue to stress the need to get better. Recently, the ΣAE house hosted a philanthropy event consisting of an all-you-can-eat chicken wing bar with a series of raffle prizes. The proceeds for Children's Miracle Network were in excess of \$2,400.

Recruitment

We had the best summer recruitment in many years. The new member class consists of 33 men and is the largest class of any fraternity at K-State. The class is composed of Putnam and Wabash scholars, as well as all-state athletes from Kansas and Missouri. We are proud they joined ΣAE .

and we will watch them carefully as they grow into True Gentlemen.

Academics

After achieving a 3.1 GPA in the spring, our new goal is to obtain a 3.2 for the fall semester and win the Province Zeta award for best GPA. Over time, we have won this award more often than any Province Zeta chapter. We are looking to regain the leadership position through brotherly competition. Winning the Province award would put us in the top five for grades among all fraternities.

ΣAE accomplished a great deal last semester

and is hungry for more. However, none of this would happen without the alumni support we receive day in and day out. I say with confidence that the best times are ahead for Kansas Beta. So again, I thank all of our gracious alumni who have supported us through the years and continue to support us today.

Province Zeta Leadership School Hosted at Kansas State

ansas Beta hosted the annual Province Zeta Leadership School on September 12-14. Eminent Supreme Archon Brad Cohan, Arizona '85, was the honored speaker on Friday and Saturday. He also met with the presidents and education directors to answer questions concerning the new True Gentleman experience. The program continues all four years of a member's college experience and includes recruits being initiated 96 hours after they have signed a formal bid card. It was the largest province event in recent history, with 175 attending.

Many were impressed with the Kansas State Alumni Center and Leadership Studies Building—K-State proud! After the last session on Friday, there was a brotherhood event at the chapter house showcasing all of the renovations and updates. On Sunday, a food packaging philanthropic experience occurred where \$1,000 was raised from all the chapters packaging food for Liberia to aid in the Ebola epidemic.

Edwin Wingate '51 entered Chapter Eternal on July 6 from pancreatic cancer. While at Kansas State, he led the debate team, was a member of ROTC, and, after service as a captain in the United States Air Force, graduated in 1959 from the University of California, Berkeley, School of Business. He worked for a decade specializing in labor negotiations for Southern California Gas Company and Continental Airlines and moved to the Twin Cities in 1971 as a human resources vice president at Toro. He also worked at Pillsbury in Minneapolis and at Shaklee in Emeryville, Calif., and was Dayton-Hudson's senior VP of human resources from 1980 until his retirement in 1997. He served as an elder at Faith Presbyterian Church in Minnetonka.

Paul Jones '54 entered Chapter Eternal on September 12, 2013. He was the long-time publisher and editor of the Lyons Daily News and former four-term mayor of Lyons, Kan. Paul was awarded the annual Chamber of Commerce Distinguished Service Award in 1989. He was chairman of the Christmas Bell and Star committee for more than 30 years and founded the Bell and Star Foundation, which now provides financial support for many of the yearly expenses of the famous Christmas decorations. He and his wife, Judith, were avid travelers, having been to all 50 states. His travels took him to five continents and 39 foreign countries.

James R. McConnell '62 entered Chapter Eternal on June 16, 2013. He was a highly sought-after high school athlete and was offered a professional baseball contract but opted to attend Kansas State University and play basketball under head coach Tex Winter. At Kansas State, he met his wife, Nancy Becraft, and they were married for 46 years. After graduating, Bob and Nancy moved to Overland Park, where he began work as a chemical engineer for Bendix Corporation. He continued to play handball, tennis, racquetball, table tennis, and golf, and would gladly accept any invitation to compete, sometimes playing left-handed so that his opponent would have a fair chance. He later switched careers and worked for the United States Department of Agriculture as a computer programmer.
